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## Supply List – Embroidery Stitches for Quilters

### Class Description

18<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> century women were not just quilters – they were needlewomen. With the wonderful array of threads available today, learn embroidery stitches that can be used to add extra “WOW” to your pieced or appliquéd quilts. And with the popularity of wool appliqué today, embroidery embellishment takes the popular primitive look to a new level of refinement!

We will learn Stem Stitch, Couching, Lazy Daisy and Chain Stitches, French and Colonial Knots, Seed Stitch, Circular Rhodes Knot, and Laid Work. When we learn the Buttonhole Stitch, we’ll practice several variations – all easy and oh so dramatic!

### Supply List

You will need (2) 18” pieces of good quality white or light colored broadcloth, a small embroidery hoop with screw fastener, #24 Chenille embroidery needles, thimble (optional), black or brown **Pigma**<sup>TM</sup> pen, and a few strands of embroidery floss or perle cotton. Supplies will be available for purchase in class for a reasonable fee.
